Undergraduate Degree Program Options

B.S. Development & Family Studies, with Teacher Certification:

- Human Development & Family Studies 8th-12th Grade Teacher Certification
- Family & Consumer Science 6th-12th Grade Teacher Certification

Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements, with the exception of American History and Government/Political Science, and the College & Major requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: MATH 1316, 1324, 1325 or 1425, 1332, 1342 or 1442 or 2342 or 2442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413 or 2513

UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

For students not majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (see an Academic Advisor for more options).

UNT Core: American History

Two courses chosen from: HIST 1301, 1302, 2301

UNT Core: Government/Political Science

GOVT 2305 and 2306

UNT Core: Creative Arts

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301 or 1304; DRAM 1310; MUSI 1306 or 1307; SPCH 2341

UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

One course chosen from: ENGL 2332 or 2333; HIST 2321 or 2322; PHIL 1301, 1304, 2303, 2306, or 2316

HDFS 2313 taken at UNT is recommended to fulfill both the Language, Philosophy and Culture core and Development and Family Studies, Teacher Certification program requirements.

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the Development and Family Studies program requirements (see "Program Requirements" below).

UNT Core: Component Area Option Category I

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the Development and Family Studies program requirements (see "Program Requirements" below).

UNT Core: Component Area Option Category II

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the Development and Family Studies program requirements (see "Program Requirements" below).

Development & Family Studies: Program Requirements

- TECA 1354 (fulfills both Social & Behavioral Sciences core and program requirements)
- BIOL/HECO 1322 (fulfills both CAO Category I core and program requirements)
- TECA 1303 (fulfills both CAO Category II core and program requirements)
- BCIS 1305 or 1405 or COSC 1315 or 1415

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Development & Family Studies: Teacher Certification Option

Admission to Teacher Education Program:

Prior to enrolling in the education courses, students must:

- be a junior (60 credit hours earned)
- have a 2.75 UNT GPA
- have a 2.75 overall GPA (includes courses transferred to UNT, plus all courses taken at UNT)
- have appropriate exam scores on either the SAT, ACT or PRAXIS Core Academic Skills for Educators Exam
- be actively enrolled at UNT and have a degree plan completed or in process in the Student Advising Office
- have completed the application process and been admitted to Teacher Education through the College of Education Student Advising Office in Matthews Hall, Room 105

Continuation in the Teacher Education Program is not guaranteed by the admission process.

Eligibility for Teacher Certification and Endorsements:

Teacher certification is a function of the State Board for Educator Certification. Completion of the bachelor's degree and the required education courses does not necessarily result in certification by the agency. In order to receive recommendation for teacher certification through the University of North Texas, students must have:

- successfully completed an approved teacher education program for the preparation of secondary teachers
- successfully completed student teaching, including attendance at appropriate seminars and passing a comprehensive teacher preparation examination
- passed the content examination from the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences.

Students completing course requirements for the Human Development and Family Studies teacher certificate will be eligible to apply to the National Council of Family Relations for the Certified Family Life Educator credential.

Students completing course requirements for the Family and Consumer Sciences teacher certificate will be eligible to apply to the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences for the Certified Family and Consumer Sciences credential.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements:

- A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the [general university requirements](#) section of the UNT catalog and the College of Education requirements.
- Secondary certification degree requires 2.75 UNT, Overall (including all transferred courses), teaching field, and education GPAs for graduation.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:

UNT complies with the [mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature](#) regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college
