# Recreation, Event, & Sport Management: Internship

Each Recreation, Event, & Sport Management student is required to complete a total of 12 credit hours of internship/professional development [12 credit hours of on-site experience (RESM 4100)]. Program management and sport management students must complete a minimum of 480 clock hours to meet this requirement.

RESM 4100, Internship in Recreation, Parks and Leisure Agencies (12 hours) is required of all majors in an approved setting appropriate for their career interest area. The student must meet several requirements prior to enrollment in this course, including:

- completion of the required recreation major courses
- a minimum of 2.00 overall GPA (including all transferred courses), with a C or better in each recreation course
- verification of 400 hours of paid or voluntary experience in a recreation, park, or leisure service agency within the past 48 months
- departmental permission to enroll in the course

The internship is a full-time (i.e., 40 hours per week) affiliation with an approved agency. It is usually taken during the last term/ semester.

# **Special Notes**

#### Hours Required and General/College Requirements:

- A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the <u>general</u> <u>university requirements</u> section of the UNT catalog and the College of Education requirements.
- A minimum grade of C is required in each recreation course, and a 2.5 GPA is required on courses in the major. A minimum UNT GPA of 2.0 and an overall GPA of 2.0 are required for graduation. Overall GPA includes all course work transferred plus that taken at UNT.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the <u>mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature</u> regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college
