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Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements, with the exception of American History and the College & Major requirements, are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

ENGL 1302 is recommended for best preparation for state certification exams.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: MATH 1316, 1324, 1325 or 1425, 1332, 1342 or 1442 or 2342 or 2442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413 or 2513

UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

For students not majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (see an Academic Advisor for more options).

UNT Core: American History

Two courses chosen from: HIST 1301, 1302, 2301

HIST 1301 & 1302 are recommended for best preparation for state certification exams.

UNT Core: Government/Political Science

GOVT 2305 and 2306

UNT Core: Creative Arts

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301 or 1304; DRAM 1310; MUSI 1306; SPCH 2341

UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Interdisciplinary Studies 4-8 English, Language Arts & Reading Certification program requirements (see "Program Requirements" next column).

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Interdisciplinary Studies 4-8 English, Language Arts & Reading Certification program requirements (see "Program Requirements" below).

UNT Core: Component Area Option Category I

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Interdisciplinary Studies 4-8 English, Language Arts & Reading Certification program requirements (see "Program Requirements" below).

UNT Core: Component Area Option Category II

One additional course from any other UNT Core requirement. This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Interdisciplinary Studies 4-8 English, Language Arts & Reading Certification program requirements.

Interdisciplinary Studies, 4-8 English, Language Arts & Reading Certification: Program Requirements

- ENGL 2332 or 2333 (fulfills both Language, Philosophy & Culture core and program requirements)
- COMM 1307 (fulfills both Social & Behavioral Sciences core and program requirements)
- SPCH 1311 or 1315 (fulfills both CAO Category I core and program requirements)
- MATH (two courses in addition to the one course taken for the core); MATH 1314 or 1414 or 1324 is recommended (see mathematics core list for additional options)"
- Life & Physical Sciences (two courses in addition to the two courses taken for the core, selected from the approved core list)
- CDEC 1359 or 1459 or EDUC 2301 (substitutes for EDSP 3210, but will not count toward advanced hours requirement)
- EDUC 1325 (recommended) or 1301 (substitutes for EDEE 2000)

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the UNT Interdisciplinary Studies major.

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Interdisciplinary Studies, 4-8 Certification: Admission to Teacher Education Program

Admission to Teacher Education:

Students must be admitted to Teacher Education before enrolling in most education courses. For admission to elementary or middle school teacher education, a student must have:

- Active enrollment at UNT and a completed or in-process degree audit in the College of Education Student Advising Office;
- Minimum THEA scores of 240 reading, 230 math, and 220 writing OR approved exemption;
- Approved Interview Questionnaire;
- Junior standing (60 credit hours earned);
- A 2.75 GPA (All Courses) AND a 2.75 Core GPA with all courses complete;
- Application for Admission to Teacher Education upon completion of all requirements, above.

Continuation in the Teacher Education program is not guaranteed by the admission process.

Professional Development School (PDS):

Students will participate in a Professional Development School during the final two long semesters of their degree/certification program which requires they be available during normal public school hours. Courses taken during the first semester of PDS include both lecture classes and field experience. The second semester of PDS includes one or two lecture classes and 15 weeks of student teaching with a one-hour-per-week seminar. Students must meet all prerequisites to participate in the PDS and public school field experience. A criminal history check is required prior to field experience.

Recommendation for Teacher Certificate:

All undergraduate students seeking recommendation for initial teacher certification through UNT must:

- Be admitted to Teacher Education at UNT;
- Successfully complete an approved teacher education program for the preparation of early childhood, middle grades, secondary or all-level teachers;
- Successfully complete student teaching, which includes attending appropriate seminars and passing a comprehensive teacher preparation examination; and
- Pass all required state certification exams; and
- Apply for teacher certification and complete fingerprinting.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements:

- A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the [general university requirements](#) section of the UNT catalog and the College of Education requirements.
- All core, certification requirement, and academic major courses must be completed with a grade of C or better and a minimum GPA of 2.75 in the completed core and academic major in order to advance to professional development school.
- All core, certification requirement, academic major, and professional development school courses must be completed with a grade of C or better for graduation.
- A minimum GPA of 2.75 in the completed core, academic major, and professional development school courses; and a minimum GPA of 2.0 in UNT courses and overall (overall GPA includes all course work transferred plus that taken at UNT) is required for graduation.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:

UNT complies with the [mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature](#) regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
