2012-2013 Texas Common Course Numbering System Transfer Guide

The College of Arts and Sciences expects students to have completed the Texas State recommended high school program and be ready to enroll in Language 2040 (TCCNS: Language 2311) and a college level mathematics course. If you are not prepared for this level, the necessary prerequisites will either replace electives or increase the hours required for this degree.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

UNT Core: English Composition & Rhetoric

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

UNT Core: Mathematics

This requirement will be met by fulfilling College of Arts & Sciences mathematics requirement (see next column).

UNT Core: Natural Science

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Social Science with Secondary Education Certification laboratory science requirement (see next column).

UNT Core: U.S. History

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Social Science with Secondary Education Certification major requirements (see page two).

UNT Core: Political Science

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Social Science with Secondary Education Certification major requirements (see page two).

UNT Core: Visual & Performing Arts

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301, 1303, or 1304; DRAM 1310; MUSI 1306 or 1307; SPCH 2341

UNT Core: Humanities

One course chosen from: ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, or 2333; PHIL 1304 or 2316

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Social Science with Secondary Education Certification major requirements (see page two).

UNT Core: Discovery

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Social Science with Secondary Education Certification major requirements (see page two).

UNT Core: Capstone

This requirement will be met by fulfilling teacher certification requirements.

College of Arts & Sciences Core: Foreign Language

Any foreign language 2311 and 2312.

Courses must be taken in the same language.

NOTE: Prerequisites for foreign language 2311 and 2312 courses are 1311 and 1312 or 1411 and 1412 or 1511 and 1512. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details.

Social Science, with Secondary Education Certification in Social Studies: Major Requirements

- ECON 2301 *and* 2302
- GEOG 1302
- GEOG 1303
- GEOL 1401 or 1101/1301 (fulfills both Laboratory Sciences core and major requirements)
- GOVT 2301 *and* 2302; or GOVT 2305 *and* 2306 (fulfills both Political Science core and major requirements)
- HIST 1301 *and* 1302 (fulfills both U.S. History core and major requirements)
- HIST 2301 (substitutes for UNT's HIST 4700, but will not count toward the advanced hours requirement)
- HIST 2321 *and* 2322
- PSYC 2301
- SOCI 1301

ECON, PSYC, and SOCI courses listed above fulfill both Social & Behavioral Sciences core and major requirements.

GEOG 1303, HIST 2321 and 2322 fulfill both Discovery core and major requirements.

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the UNT Social Science with Secondary Education Certification major.

Teacher Education Program

Admission to Teacher Education Program:

Prior to enrolling in the education courses, students must:

- be a junior (60 credit hours earned)
- have a 2.75 UNT GPA
- have a 2.75 overall GPA (includes courses transferred to UNT, plus all courses taken at UNT)
- have minimum THEA scores of 240 reading, 230 math, and 220 writing
- be actively enrolled at UNT and have an official degree audit with certification requirements included
- have completed the application process and been admitted to Teacher Education through the College of Education Student Advising Office in Matthews Hall, Room 105

Continuation in the Teacher Education Program is not guaranteed by the admission process.

Teacher Certification Information

Students must complete the required 21 hours in upper-level education courses and meet all GPA requirements to apply for state Certification. In order to enroll for the first required education course, the student must make application to the certification program in the College of Education. No TCCNS options available.

To be certified to teach in the State of Texas, the student must successfully pass the following exams:

Exam #1 TExES: Pedagogy & Professional Responsibilities (EC-12)

Exam #2 TExES: Social Studies (8-12)

Additional requirements for Teacher Certification in Social Studies include a 2.75 overall GPA (including all transferred courses), a 2.75 UNT GPA, a 2.75 major GPA, and a 2.75 GPA in Teacher Education courses.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree as specified in the "[General University Requirements](#)" section of the UNT catalog and the College of Arts and Sciences requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college
