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**Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Electives** 

For many BAAS students who have completed an associate's degree, elective hours consist of additional occupationally specific credits that were not applied to the student's Occupational Specialization.

In selecting electives, students should exercise caution to insure they fulfill UNT's requirement of 42 hours of advanced-level course work.

**Please note** a lower-level course that is determined to be equivalent to a UNT upper-level course does not satisfy the requirements of advanced hours.

Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Additional Information

A combination of correspondence, credit by examination, extension or military service credit not to exceed 30 hours may be accepted toward the degree.

No more than 18 hours of correspondence courses with a maximum of 6 hours of advanced work will be accepted.

#### Special Notes

**Hours Required and General/College Requirements:** A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences degree as specified in the "General University Requirements" section of the UNT catalog and the College of Public Affairs and Community Service requirements.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the <u>mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature</u> regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
