

- All students entering UNT who wish to pursue the Bachelor of Science with a major in Hospitality Management enter as pre-majors. Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to the Hospitality Management major. To be admitted to major status, a pre-major must meet the requirements listed in "Admission to hospitality major" below.
- The mission of the hospitality management division is to educate students for management and leadership in the hospitality industry and to lead the profession through excellence in teaching, research and service.
- The Hospitality Management program at UNT features a unique laboratory environment. Students put theory into practice in a state-of-the-art student-operated restaurant on campus and through work experiences and internships at hospitality operations in the Dallas–Fort Worth region.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements, with the exception of American History and Government/Political Science, and the College & Major requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: MATH 1316, 1324, 1325 or 1425, 1332, 1342 or 1442 or 2342 or 2442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413 or 2513

UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

For students not majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (see an Academic Advisor for more options).

UNT Core: American History

Two courses chosen from: HIST 1301, 1302, 2301

UNT Core: Government/Political Science

GOVT 2305 and 2306

UNT Core: Creative Arts

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301 or 1304; DRAM 1310; MUSI 1306 or 1307; SPCH 2341

UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the Hospitality Management program requirements (see "Other Course Requirements").

UNT Core: Discovery

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism requirements (see "Major Requirements" below).

UNT Core: Capstone

The Capstone Core requirement is unique to UNT and will be fulfilled by an advanced course at UNT.

Note: The Core Capstone courses are under review by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and are subject to change.

College of Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism: Core

No TCCNS Options Available

Admission to hospitality major

To declare a major in hospitality management, a student must have completed at least 30 hours of college course work, including the courses listed below, have a cumulative UNT GPA of at least 2.5, and have completed at least 100 documented work hours in the hospitality industry. A grade of C or above must be earned in each merchandising and hospitality management course completed in residence or transferred to UNT. This includes all courses with prefixes CMHT, MDSE, HFMD, DRTL, and HMGT.

- HMGT 1420 at UNT only.
- HMGT 1470 at UNT only.
- HMGT 1500 at UNT only.
- HMGT 2280 at UNT only.
- HMGT 2480 at UNT only.
- HMGT 2790 at UNT only.
- HMGT 2860 at UNT only.

Pre-majors who have completed these requirement and who have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 may file a formal application for major status. Approved majors may then enroll in those advanced courses designated "hospitality majors/minor only."

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Hospitality Management: Major Requirements

Lower-level TCCNS options:

BIOL/HECO 1322 (fulfills Discovery core and three hours of major requirements)

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the UNT Hospitality Management major.

Hospitality Management: Other Course Requirements

Lower-level TCCNS options:

ECON 2301 (fulfills both Social & Behavioral Sciences core and program requirements).

Other Requirements

GPA Requirements:

- It is required that students entering the College of Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism have a minimum grade point average of at least 2.5 on all courses completed at UNT.
- A grade of "C" or above must be earned in each merchandising and hospitality management course completed in residence or transferred to UNT. This includes all courses with a prefix of CMHT, MDSE, HFMD, HFMD, DRTL, and HMG.T.

Academic requirements for graduation with a BS from the College of Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism include:

- A minimum of 2.50 grade point average in the professional field, with minimum grades of "C" required in all CMHTM MDSE, HFMD, DRTL, and HMG.T courses;
- A minimum of 2.50 grade point average in all courses completed at UNT; and
- A minimum of 2.50 grade point average in all work attempted, including transfer, correspondence, extension and residence work.

Teacher Certification Option

The school offers the Bachelor of Science degree with a major in hospitality management leading to certification in Family and Consumer Sciences (Grades 8-12) and Hospitality, Nutrition and Food Science (Grades 8-12). For more information about degree requirements contact the College of Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism.

Admission to Teacher Education Program:

Prior to enrolling in the education courses, students must:

- be a junior (60 credit hours earned)
- have a 2.75 UNT GPA
- have a 2.75 overall GPA (includes courses transferred to UNT, plus all courses taken at UNT)
- have minimum THEA scores of 240 reading, 230 math, and 220 writing
- be actively enrolled at UNT and have an official degree audit with certification requirements included
- have completed the application process and been admitted to Teacher Education through the College of Education Student Advising Office in Matthews Hall, Room 105

Continuation in the Teacher Education Program is not guaranteed by the admission process.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements:

A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the [general university requirements](#) section of the UNT catalog and the College of Merchandising, Hospitality and Tourism requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:

UNT complies with the [mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature](#) regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
