<sup>1</sup> Note on MULB 18xx courses: up to 4 hours of MULB (large performing ensemble) can be received in transfer, no TCCNS values established. All music majors must have a minimum of 4 semesters of MULB at UNT. All music degrees require a minimum of 8 semesters of MULB credit.

<sup>2</sup> Students must demonstrate foreign language proficiency by exam or complete the required prerequisites before enrolling in FREN or GERM 2040 and 2050 (TCCNS: FREN or GERM 2311 and 2312). Prerequisites for foreign language FREN/GERM 2040 and 2050 are FREN/GERM 1010 and 1020 (TCCNS: FREN/GERM 1311 and 1312 or 1411 and 1412 or 1511 and 1512).

<sup>3</sup> Available courses are MUMH 4050, MUMH 4760 or MUMH 4780.

<sup>4</sup> Available courses are MUTH 3410, 3520, MUCP 3080, or 4310.

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- All students applying to the College of Music must audition and be accepted on their major performing instrument (or voice). Auditions are held early in the spring semester for the following year's admittance. Lessons from any other school are not automatically equivalent to UNT lessons.
- All Music majors are required to pass the UNT Music Theory Proficiency and the UNT Piano Proficiency for graduation. The lower level courses in piano, aural skills and music theory at UNT are designed to prepare students directly for these examinations. Students who transfer in these courses are responsible for all content covered in UNT courses. Students may choose to repeat theory and aural skills courses if not prepared for proficiency exams.
- All Music majors also must pass a computer proficiency, and the Upper Divisional Exam and Concentration Proficiency Exam in the principal instrument or voice.

### Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements, with the exception of American History and Government/Political Science, and the College & Major requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

#### UNT Core: Communication

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the College of Music Communication requirement (see next column).

#### UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: MATH 1316, 1324, 1325 or 1425, 1332, 1342 or 1442 or 2342 or 2442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413 or 2513

#### UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling College of Music Life & Physical Sciences requirement (see next column).

#### UNT Core: American History

Two courses chosen from: HIST 1301, 1302, 2301

#### UNT Core: Government/Political Science

GOVT 2305 and 2306

#### UNT Core: Creative Arts

This requirement will be met by fulfilling College of Music Core course requirements (see next page).

#### UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

One course chosen from: ENGL 2332 or 2333; HIST 2321 or 2322; PHIL 1301, 1304, 2303, 2306, or 2316

#### UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

One course chosen from: ANTH 2346 or 2351; COMM 1307; CRIJ 1301; ECON 2301 or 2302; GEOG 1303; PSYC 2301; SOCI 1301; SPCH 1318; TECA 1354

#### UNT Core: Discovery

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301; BIOL/HECO 1322; COMM 1307; MATH 2305 or 2405; SPCH 1311 or 1315; TECA 1303

#### UNT Core: Capstone

The Capstone Core requirement is unique to UNT and will be fulfilled by an advanced course at UNT.

*Note: The Core Capstone courses are under review by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and are subject to change.*

#### College of Music: Communication

ENGL 1301 and ENGL 1302

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

#### College of Music: Life & Physical Sciences

At least 6 semester hours (two courses) in Life & Physical Sciences.

**Note:** All Bachelor of Music students are required to complete Science & Technology of Musical Sound (PHYS 1270) offered at UNT (no TCCNS options available); counts for Life & Physical Sciences core.

#### Performance (Organ): Other Requirements

The following music proficiencies are required:

- Piano Proficiency
- Computer Proficiency
- Music Theory Proficiency

#### College of Music: Admission Requirements

**College Admissions Requirements:** Admission to the College of Music is contingent on clear admission to the University. Entering transfer students interested in majoring in Music must qualify by audition on their principal instrument or voice. Preference will be given to applications received by April 1 for fall admission. For additional procedures and opportunities, please contact the College of Music.

Students unable to audition in person may submit a recording representative of their performance abilities.

Transfer students will take placement examinations in piano and possibly music theory at New Student Orientation.

At Freshman Orientation, students will take placement examinations in piano. Transfer students will take similar examinations at New Student Orientation during registration week.

#### Special Notes

**Hours Required and General/College Requirements:** A minimum of 130 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Music degree as specified in the [general university requirements](#) section of the UNT catalog and the College of Music requirements.

A minimum overall GPA (including all transferred courses) of 2.00 is required for graduation.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the [mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature](#) regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
