Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements, with the exception of American History and Government/Political Science, and the College & Major requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of $\mbox{\ensuremath{\text{C}}}\mbox{\ensuremath{\text{C}}}$ or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: MATH 1316, 1324, 1325 or 1425, 1332, 1342 or 1442 or 2342 or 2442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413 or 2513

MATH 1342, 1442, 2342 or 2442 are recommended.

UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

For students <u>not</u> majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (see an Academic Advisor for more options).

UNT Core: American History

UNT Core: Government/Political Science

UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

One course chosen from: ENGL 2332 or 2333; HIST 2321 or 2322; PHIL 1301, 1304, 2303, 2306, or 2316

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

One course chosen from: ANTH 2346 or 2351; COMM 1307; CRIJ 1301; ECON 2301 or 2302; GEOG 1303; PSYC 2301; SOCI 1301; SPCH 1318; TECA 1354

UNT Core: Discovery

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301; BIOL/HECO 1322; COMM 1307; MATH 2305 or 2405; SPCH 1311 or 1315; TECA 1303

UNT Core: Capstone

The Capstone Core requirement is unique to UNT and will be fulfilled by an advanced course at UNT.

Note: The Core Capstone courses are under review by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and are subject to change.

Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Professional Development Concentrations

Students must complete 36 hours of Professional Development consisting of two or three separate multidisciplinary concentrations. Each concentration will consist of a minimum of 12 credit hours that serve to enhance the skills a student has acquired through prior education or are complimentary to the student's career plans.

The concentrations may come from any department at UNT or may consist of technical/professional coursework already completed at a community college (or in the military) as part of an associate's degree.

Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Professional Foundations

Students must complete three interdisciplinary courses (9 hours) from the College of Public Affairs and Community Service to satisfy foundational skills in:

- Research & Information gathering
- Managing a Career in Today's Workplace
- Pathways to Civic Engagement

Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Occupational Specialization

Comprised of courses related to a specific occupation, field or subject. It typically consists of the field or occupationally-specific coursework completed for an associate's degree. Active-duty military or veterans may receive credit for technical or other formal training courses under this component of the degree.

The occupational specialization is often transferred from a community college as part of an associate degree or professional certificate.

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Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Electives

For many BAAS students who have completed an associate's degree, elective hours consist of additional occupationally specific credits that were not applied to the student's Occupational Specialization.

In selecting electives, students should exercise caution to insure they fulfill UNT's requirement of 36 hours of advanced-level course work.

Please note a lower-level course that is determined to be equivalent to a UNT upper-level course does not satisfy the requirements of advanced hours.

Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences: Additional Information

A combination of correspondence, credit by examination, extension or military service credit not to exceed 30 hours may be accepted toward the degree.

No more than 18 hours of correspondence courses with a maximum of 6 hours of advanced work will be accepted.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 36 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences degree as specified in the general university requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Public Affairs and Community Service requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the <u>mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature</u> regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
