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- This program is designed to prepare students for entry into the music teaching profession and related career areas. The curriculum emphasizes public school teacher competencies in music performance, literature, and pedagogy. This degree program also leads to Texas teacher certification in all-level music.
- All students applying to the College of Music must audition and be accepted on their major performing instrument (or voice). Auditions are held early in the spring semester for the following year's admittance. Lessons from any other school are not automatically equivalent to UNT lessons.
- All Music majors are required to pass the UNT Piano Proficiency for graduation. The lower level courses in piano at UNT are designed to prepare students directly for this examination. Students who transfer in these courses are responsible for all content covered in UNT courses. Students may choose to repeat courses if not prepared the proficiency exam.
- All Music majors also must pass the Upper Divisional Exam and Concentration Proficiency Exam in the principal instrument or voice.
- Music Education requires a grade of 'C' or better in each required music course and an overall 2.75 grade point average.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and **ENGL 1302** or **2311**

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

ENGL 1301 and 1302 are recommended.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: **MATH 1316, 1324, 1325, 1332, 1342 or 1442, 1350, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413**

MATH 1332 is recommended.

UNT Core: Life & Physical Sciences

PHYS 1270, required for the major, will satisfy 3 of the 6 hours required for the UNT Core. For students **not** majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing one additional course from the list below is recommended (Consult UNT Advisor for more options).

- Piano Proficiency
- Concentration Proficiency in the principal instrument
- Secondary Voice Proficiency

College of Music: Admissions Requirements

Admission to the College of Music is contingent on clear admission to the University. Those students who intend to be music majors must qualify by audition on their principal instrument or voice. Preference will be given to applications received by December 1 for fall admission. For additional procedures and opportunities, please contact the College of Music.

Students unable to audition in person may submit a recording representative of their performance abilities.

At Freshman Orientation, students will take placement examinations in piano. Transfer students will take similar examinations at Transfer Orientation.



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Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 128 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Music degree as specified in the general university requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Music requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding [Core Requirements](#) for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as “core complete” for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
