#### **UNT Core: Core Option Courses**

One course for this requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. International Studies (Global Conflict) program requirements. In addition, complete one course from Option A or Option B.

#### College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Foreign Language

Any foreign language\* 2311 and 2312.

Courses must be taken in the same language.

\* Latin and Sign Language courses will not count toward the major requirements (see next page).

NOTE: Prerequisites for foreign language 2311 and 2312 courses are 1411 and 1412. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details.

#### College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Distribution Requirement

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete two courses (3 hours each) of advanced work at UNT in:

- Cultural Diversity & Global Issues: Focused on cultural diversity in regional, national or international contexts, depending on the nature of the course. 3 hours from an approved Study Abroad program can substitute for this requirement.
- Communication & Digital Skills: Focused on developing written, oral or visual communication skills using discipline-specific digital technologies.

Major courses can be used to satisfy both the CLASS Distribution requirement and your major requirements; see your academic advisor for assistance in making the best choice of CLASS Distribution courses.

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#### International Studies w/ Global Conflict: Major Requirements

No TCCNS options available.

INST 2100 (UNT only), a required course for the major, also fulfills 3 hours towards the Core Option Courses core requirement.

ANTH 3200, 3220, 3300, 3400, 3500, 3700, FREN 3040, 4060, 4310, GERM 3040, 3050, ITAL 3040, 3050, JAPN 3020 (all offered at UNT only) are options for the major and can also fulfill the Language, Philosophy & Culture and Core Option Courses core requirements.

EADP 4050 (offered at UNT only) is an option for the major and can also fulfill the Social & Behavioral Sciences core requirement.

Students are strongly encouraged to take advantage of Study Abroad opportunities. Students are also encouraged to do an internship related to their area of concentration; only 3 hours will apply towards the major.

Courses listed above do not include all courses required for the UNT B.A. International Studies (Global Conflict) major.

#### International Studies w/ Global Conflict: Other Course Requirements

6 upper-division hours in a foreign language of the student's choice. Latin and Sign Language courses will not count toward this requirement.

International students who attended high school in a non-native English speaking country and have been exempted from the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences foreign language requirement can substitute 6 hours of advanced English writing courses with prior approval of the International Studies director or academic advisor.

#### **Special Notes**

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding Core requirements for stateassisted institutions . Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences required curriculum and policies are located in the undergraduate catalog under the corresponding catalog year.
