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Certain degree requirements must be completed to apply for the Converged Broadcast Media (CBCM) major and to take upper-level MRTS courses. Transfer students should review the Converged Broadcast Media: Major Requirements section for quidelines on acceptance to the major.

Community College RTVB and FLMC courses do not apply towards a B.A. in Converged Broadcast Media.

Only 12 hours of MRTS courses taken at other institutions may be applied toward the major.

Students majoring in Converged Broadcast Media are required to have a minimum grade of 'C' in all MRTS courses to count toward the major. Students may have only two attempts for a grade of 'C' or better for each required MRTS course.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Foreign Language

TCCNS options:

Any foreign language up through 2312

Courses must be taken in the same language.

Note: Prerequisites for foreign language 2312 courses are 1411, 1412, and 2311. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details.

College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Distribution Requirement

No TCCNS options available.

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete two courses (3 hours each) of advanced work at UNT in:

- Cultural Diversity & Global Issues: Focused on cultural diversity in regional, national or international contexts, depending on the nature of the course. 3 hours from an approved Study Abroad program can substitute for this requirement.
- Communication & Digital Skills: Focused on developing written, oral or visual communication skills using discipline-specific digital technologies.

Major courses can be used to satisfy both the CLASS Distribution requirement and your major requirements; see your academic advisor for assistance in making the best choice of CLASS Distribution courses.



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Converged Broadcast Media: Major Requirements

TCCNS options:

- COMM 1307* or 1335* (both approved substitutions for MRTS 1330 per Texas Direct Field of Study; COMM 1307 can also fulfill the Social & Behavioral Sciences core requirement)
- COMM 2339* or 2311* (approved substitution for MRTS 2010 per Texas Direct Field of Study)
- COMM 1336* (approved substitution for MRTS 2210 per Texas Direct Field of Study)
- COMM 2303* (approved substitution for 3 of the 15 hours of advanced media arts classes per Texas Direct Field of Study)
- * These courses are part of the Texas Direct Field of Study in Radio & Television requirements. Lower-level courses substituted for advanced-level courses cannot count toward advanced hour requirements, so additional advanced elective hours may be needed.

Note: The Texas Direct Field of Study in Radio & Television can be applied to this program. For more information, please visit the <u>Texas Higher Education</u> Coordinating Board (THECB) website or consult your UNT advisor.

Students who wait until they transfer to UNT to take MRTS 1330 and 2010 must have at least a 2.75 cumulative GPA on at least 12 hours to enroll in these courses. Additionally, students who wait until they transfer to UNT to take MRTS 2210 must have completed MRTS 1330 or approved substitutes, MRTS 2010 or approved substitutes, and have a 2.75 cumulative GPA to enroll in MRTS 2210. MRTS 2210 or approved substitute and a 2.75 cumulative GPA are required to enroll in all 3000/4000 level MRTS courses at UNT.

Note: Only Media Arts (MRTS) and Converged Broadcast Media (CBCM) majors can take MRTS Courses.

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.A. Converged Broadcast Media major.

Converged Broadcast Media: Additional Requirements

Minimum standards for enrollment in MRTS courses:

- Completion of 12 credit hours at UNT and at least a 2.75 UNT GPA.
- Converged Broadcast Media majors must maintain a UNT GPA of 2.75.
 Converged Broadcast Media major students whose GPAs fall below 2.75 cannot enroll in any Media Arts classes until they return their UNT GPA to 2.75 or higher.

A minimum 2.0 cumulative UNT GPA and a 2.75 major GPA is required to graduate. Only 12 hours of **MRTS** courses taken at other institutions may be applied toward the 42-hour requirement toward the major.

Students majoring in Converged Broadcast Media are required to have a minimum grade of 'C' in all **MRTS** courses to count toward the major. Students may have only two attempts for a grade of 'C' or higher for each required **MRTS** course.

Students must observe prerequisites for each MRTS course. If a student has not completed prerequisites for a course with a grade of 'C' or higher, the student is subject to administrative drop from the course without notice. Prerequisites are listed with individual course descriptions.

Students may register for only one section of a course at a time. Students registered for more than one section of a course will bedropped from all sections of that course without notice. The policy does not apply to courses such as special topics, which may bear the same course number but are different topics and are therefore different courses.

Specific competency and departmental approval for internship, seminar and special problem courses are required.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding <u>Core requirements</u> for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences required curriculum and policies are located in the <u>undergraduate catalog</u> under the corresponding catalog year.
