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Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or higher is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

UNT Core: Mathematics

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Economics major requirements.

UNT Core: Life and Physical Sciences

For students <u>not</u> majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (Consult UNT advisor for more options).

UNT Core: American History

UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

One course chosen from: **ARTS** 1303; **ENGL** 2321, 2326, 2331, 2341, or 2351; **HIST** 2321 or 2322; **PHIL** 1301, 1304, 2303, or 2306

UNT Core: Social and Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Economics major requirements.

UNT Core: Core Option Courses

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Economics major requirements.

College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Foreign Language Requirement

Students may complete either of two options to satisfy the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences foreign language requirement:

Option I:

TCCNS options:

Any foreign language up through 2312

Courses must be taken in the same language.

Note: Prerequisites for foreign language 2312 courses are 1411, 1412, and 2311. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details.

Option II:

6 hours of mathematics in addition to MATH 2313 or 2413 and MATH 2314 or

Lower-level TCCNS options:

- MATH 2315 or 2415
- MATH 2318 or 2418
- MATH 2305

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.S. Economics major.

Economics: Major Requirements

TCCNS options:

- ECON 2301 (also fulfills a portion of the Core Option Courses core requirement)
- ECON 2302 (also fulfills the Social & Behavioral Sciences core requirement)

Grade of 'B' or higher required for both courses.

Students must complete 18 additional upper-division hours above the 3000 level, including at least 9 hours from a pre-determined list. See the B.S. Economics program in the undergraduate catalog for specific course options.

Note: The Texas Direct Field of Study in Economics can be applied to this program. For more information, please visit the <u>Texas Higher Education</u> Coordinating Board (THECB) website or consult your UNT advisor.

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.S. Economics major.

Economics: Additional Requirements

TCCNS options:

- MATH 2313 or 2413 (also fulfills the Mathematics core requirement)
- MATH 2314 or 2414 (also fulfills a portion of the Core Option Courses core requirement)

Grade of 'C' or higher required for both courses.

A student must earn at least a 'C' in all economics courses above the 3000 level.

To graduate with a B.S. with a major in economics, a student must have a GPA of 2.5 in all economics courses (including transfer work). Students may retake UNT economic courses to improve overall economics GPA. In computing the economics GPA, only the grade in the last repetition of a course will be included.

Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.S. Economics major.



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Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding <u>Core requirements</u> for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences required curriculum and policies are located in the <u>undergraduate catalog</u> under the corresponding catalog year.
