### Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

#### UNT Core: Communication

**ENGL 1301**; and **ENGL 1302** or **2311**

A grade of 'C' or higher is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

#### UNT Core: Mathematics

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification) major requirements.

#### UNT Core: Life and Physical Sciences

For students not majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (Consult UNT advisor for more options).

#### UNT Core: American History

#### UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification) major requirements.

#### UNT Core: Social and Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification) major requirements.

#### UNT Core: Core Option Courses

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.S. Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification) major requirements.

#### Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification): Major Requirements

TCCNS options:

- **PHED 1301** or **KINE 1301** (approved substitution)
- **PHED 1338** (approved substitution and also fulfills a portion of the Core Option Courses core requirement)

*Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.S. Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification) major.*

#### Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification): Additional Requirements

TCCNS options:

- **BIOL 2101** & **2301**, or **2401** (also fulfills a portion of the Life & Physical Sciences core requirement)
- **BIOL 2102** & **2302**, or **2402** (also fulfills a portion of the Life & Physical Sciences core requirement)
- **MATH 1342** (also fulfills the Mathematics core requirement)
- **KINE 2050** (at UNT only) (also fulfills the Language, Philosophy and Culture core requirement)

To move into Tier 2, you must have completed each course in Tier 1 with a minimum grade of 'C' and have a 2.5 overall GPA or overall.

To take any additional upper-division **KINE** courses, you must have completed each course in Tier 2 with a minimum grade of 'C' and have a 2.5 overall GPA or higher.

A kinesiology course may be repeated one time in order to improve a grade to the requirement of a 'C' or higher. Following the second attempt, approval for a third attempt must be sought from the program coordinator or department.

A minimum grade of 'C' is required in each course in the major. A minimum GPA of 2.75 in the major, 2.0 in UNT courses, and overall is required for graduation. (Overall GPA includes all coursework transferred plus that taken at UNT.)

12 hours of **KINE** must be taken at UNT.

36 hours must be advanced; 24 of which must be taken at UNT.

*Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the B.S. Kinesiology (Pre-PT/Allied Health) major.*

#### Kinesiology (All-Level Teacher Certification): Required Minor

Minimum of 18 hours from area other than kinesiology, 6 of which must be advanced.

#### Kinesiology: Teacher Education Program

Prior to enrolling in the education course, students must have:

- Junior standing (minimum of 60 earned hours)
- A 2.75 overall GPA and 2.75 UNT GPA
- Acceptable scores on SAT, ACT, Praxis
- Approved online interview questionnaire
- An official degree audit with certification
- A signed application for admission to Teacher Education

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##### Kinesiology: Teacher Certification Information

No TCCNS options available.

Prior to student teaching, students must provide verification of current certifications in First Aid, CPR and Bloodborne Pathogens training. The certifications must be maintained through the duration of student teaching.

Teacher certification is a function of the State Board of Educator Certification. Completion of the bachelor's degree and the required education courses does not necessarily result in certification by the agency. In order to receive recommendation for teacher certification through the University of North Texas, students must have:

- Fulfilled all requirements of an approved 122-hour degree plan
- Received a grade of 'C' or higher for each kinesiology course and each **KINE** course
- Obtained a 2.75 GPA in each teaching field, all education courses, all UNT work, and overall (including transferred courses)
- Successfully completed student teaching, including attendance at appropriate seminars and passing a comprehensive teacher preparation examination
- Passed appropriate sections of the Texas Examinations of Educator Standards (TExES)

Students should visit their academic advisor in PEB 220 for additional information regarding degree audits. Questions about early field experience or student teaching should be addressed to the Clinical Practice Office in Matthews Hall, Room 207. Questions regarding the TExES exam should be addressed to the TExES Advising Office in Matthews Hall, Room 103 (940-369-8601).

##### Special Notes

**Hours Required and General/College Requirements:** A minimum of 122 semester hours, of which 36 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Education requirements.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding [Core requirements](#) for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
