Up to 4 hours of MULB (music laboratory) can be received in transfer, no TCCNS values established. All Bachelor of Music majors must have a minimum of 4 semesters of MULB at UNT. This degree requires a minimum of 8 semesters of MULB credit. Select from MULB 1805, 1806, 1807, 1809, 1810, 1812, or 1813. Note that MULB 1805 is specified for majors in violin, viola, cello and double bass.

Must pass the Piano Proficiency Exam, or continue enrolling in secondary piano (MUAG 1011, 1012, 1013, 1014) each long term/semester until the proficiency is passed.

Must pass the Upper Division Exam to continue in applied study at the MUAM 3500 level.

B.M. Performance (Specialization: Orchestral Instruments)

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All students applying for the Performance Degree in the College of Music must audition and be accepted on their major performing instrument (or voice). Auditions are held early in the spring semester for the following year's admittance. Lessons from any other school are not automatically equivalent to UNT lessons.

All Performance majors are required to pass the UNT Piano Proficiency exam for graduation. The lower-level courses in piano at UNT are designed to prepare students directly for this examination. Students who transfer in these courses are responsible for all content covered in UNT courses.

Performance majors also must pass the Upper Divisional exam in the principal instrument or voice.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or higher is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

ENGL 1301 and 1302 are recommended.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: BUSI 2305; MATH 1324, 1325, 1332, 1342, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413

MATH 1332 is recommended.

Performance (Orchestral Instruments): Additional Requirements

All non-keyboard majors must enroll in secondary piano each long term/semester until proficiency is passed.

Students who specialize in woodwinds are required to take MUTH 3420 as one of their two advanced electives in music.

Students who specialize in violin, viola, cello, or double bass must:

- Have a minimum of eight terms/semesters of MULB 1805 Orchestra each long term/semester
- Have a minimum of 2 hours in a performance versatility requirement chosen from a secondary stringed instrument, orchestral repertoire, or applied lessons on a baroque instrument
- Preparation of two programs of representative works from classic, romantic, and contemporary styles. The equivalent of one-half recital must be given the junior year and a full recital in the senior year

Proficiency Exams:

- Piano Proficiency Examination
- Successful completion of the Upper Division Examination in applied lessons



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Performance: Graduation Requirements

Completion of 20–32 hours in the major instrument/voice (the number of hours varies according to the instrument).

Completion of 6–16 hours supplementing the major instrument (literature, pedagogy, diction, chamber music, advanced conducting).

Demonstration of proficiency in solo playing in public recitals, and in ensemble and chamber music, as appropriate.

Presentation of all senior recital capstone requirements, content approved in advance and public performance graded by faculty. All proficiencies (including piano and the Upper Division Examination) must be met the semester before applying for the senior recital capstone.

Completion of 6–12 hours in upper-level MUTH, MUMH, MUAG, MUET, MUCE, MUCP and/or MUJS. Credit hours and courses vary by performance area.

Other music and general elective hours (see program outlines below for specific recommendations).

A total of 121-132 hours are required.

College of Music: Admission Requirements

Admission to the College of Music is contingent on clear admission to the university. Those students who intend to be Performance majors must qualify by audition on their principal instrument or voice. Preference will be given to applications received by December 1 for fall admission. For additional procedures and opportunities, please contact the College of Music.

Students unable to audition in person may submit a recording representative of their performance abilities.

All students will have the opportunity to take a placement examination in piano after attending orientation.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 121 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Music degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Music requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding <u>Core requirements</u> for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
