Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

UNT Core: Communication

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or higher is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

UNT Core: Mathematics

One course chosen from: **BUSI** 2305; **MATH** 1324, 1325, 1332, 1342, 2312 or 2412, 2313 or 2413

MATH 1342 is an option for the major and can also be applied to this requirement (see next column).

UNT Core: Life and Physical Sciences

UNT Core: American History

UNT Core: Social and Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Psychology major requirements.

Option B: COMM 2302; SPCH 1311; TECA 1303

PSYC 2330 is an option for the major and can also be applied to this requirement (see next column).

College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Foreign Language

TCCNS options:

Any foreign language up through 2312

Courses must be taken in the same language.

Note: Prerequisites for foreign language 2312 courses are 1411, 1412, and 2311. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details.

College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Distribution Requirement

No TCCNS options available.

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete two courses (3 hours each) of advanced work at UNT in:

- Cultural Diversity & Global Issues: Focused on cultural diversity in regional, national or international contexts, depending on the nature of the course. 3 hours from an approved Study Abroad program can substitute for this requirement.
- Communication & Digital Skills: This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Psychology major requirements.

Major courses can be used to satisfy both the CLASS Distribution requirement and your major requirements; see your academic advisor for assistance in making the best choice of CLASS Distribution courses.

Psychology: Major Requirements

TCCNS options:

- PSYC 2301* (also fulfills the Social & Behavioral Sciences core requirement)
- PSYC 2314* (approved substitution for PSYC 3620 per Texas Direct Field of Study)
- PSYC 2315*
- PSYC 2317§*
- PSYC 2319* (approved substitution for PSYC 3100 per Texas Direct Field of Study)
- PSYC 2330* (can also fulfill a portion of the Core Option Courses core requirement)
- MATH 1342 or 1442 (MATH 1342 can also fulfill the Mathematics core requirement)

PSYC 4600 (at UNT only) is required for the major and will fulfill the Communication & Digital Skills portion of the Distribution requirement.

§ Students transferring in an equivalent to **PSYC** 2317 must complete **PSYC** 3317 (at UNT only) during their first semester at UNT.

* These courses are part of the Texas Direct Field of Study in Psychology requirements. Lower-level courses substituted for advanced-level courses cannot count toward advanced hour requirements, so additional advanced elective hours may be needed.

Additional TCCNS **PSYC** courses may apply toward major requirements. Consult a UNT advisor prior to selecting **PSYC** courses beyond **PSYC** 2301 and 2317.

Psychology: Additional Requirements

Completion of university composition requirement with a grade of 'C' or higher to enroll in **PSYC** 3650 (at UNT only).

At least 18 hours of psychology course work must be taken at UNT. Of these 18 hours, at least 12 hours must be advanced hours.

A grade of 'C' or higher is required for each psychology class used in the major.

The following are graduation requirements for the psychology major:

- A 2.5 psychology major GPA
- A 2.0 overall GPA

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum: UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding <u>Core requirements</u> for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences required curriculum and policies are located in the undergraduate catalog under the corresponding catalog year.
