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### **Courses Recommended for Transfer**

#### College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Distribution Requirement

No TCCNS options available.

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts degree must complete two courses (3 hours each) of advanced work at UNT in:

- Cultural Diversity & Global Issues: This requirement will be met by fulfilling the B.A. Theatre (Theatre Studies) major requirements.
- Communication & Digital Skills: Focused on developing written, oral or visual communication skills using discipline-specific digital technologies.

Major courses can be used to satisfy both the CLASS Distribution requirement and your major requirements; see your academic advisor for assistance in making the best choice of CLASS Distribution courses.

#### Theatre (Theatre Studies): Major Requirements

TCCNS options:

- DRAM 1120
- **DRAM** 1330, 1341, or 1342
- **DRAM** 1322, 1351, or 2336

**THEA** 3030 (at UNT only) is required for the major and will fulfill the Creative Arts core requirement.

**THEA** 3040 (at UNT only) is required for the major and will fulfill a portion of the Core Option Courses core requirement and the Cultural Diversity & Global Issues portion of the Distribution requirement.

**Note:** The Texas Direct Field of Study in Drama can be applied to any concentration in this program. For more information, please visit the <u>Texas</u> <u>Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) website</u> or consult your UNT advisor.

A grade of 'C' or higher is required in all Theatre courses that compromise the Theatre major.

Concentrations in Acting and Design/Tech are also options for the B.A. in Theatre. Consult a UNT advisor for more information.

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#### Theatre (Theatre Studies): Additional Requirements

To remain a theatre major and to graduate, students majoring in theatre must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for all theatre courses.

Students majoring in theatre must enroll in a production course (**THEA** 3095, 4095, 4600 or equivalent at UNT) each term/semester the student performs or designs in public productions sponsored or approved by the department.

Transfer work to be substituted for required theatre courses must be approved by the departmental advisor.

The department does not allow students to obtain a 'D' or below more than twice in a theatre course comprising the major. Once the student receives the second 'D' or below in the same course, the student will be dismissed from the department.

Students who miss the first day of class without consent of the instructor are subject to be administratively dropped from the course so that other students may be added. Students who miss the first day of class because of illness or some other acceptable excuse must notify the instructor on record the day of the absence.

Students must observe prerequisites for each theatre course. If a student has not completed prerequisites for a particular course, the student is subject to administrative drop without notice. Prerequisites are listed with individual course descriptions.

Students majoring or minoring in theatre who received a grade of 'C' in any of the three prerequisite acting courses (**THEA** 1050 Acting: Fundamentals, **THEA** 2051 Theatre Voice I, or **THEA** 2351 Theatre Movement I), even if they are transferring that course in from another institution, will be required to complete an audition in order to be considered for enrollment in **THEA** 3050 Acting: Realism I.

#### Theatre (Theatre Studies): Optional Minor

A minor in a related field, such as music, dance, or art, is recommended.

#### Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree as specified in the General University Requirements section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the mandate of the Texas Legislature regarding <u>Core requirements</u> for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences required curriculum and policies are located in the <u>undergraduate catalog</u> under the corresponding catalog year.
